### Visit Brighton Pier and Sea Life aquarium



The 1,722 foot long Victorian pier has fairground attractions, two arcades, an indoor soft play area and bars & restaurants.



The world's oldest aquarium has 5,500 mesmerising creatures including Rays, Sharks, Turtles, Terrapins, Star Fish, Seahorses and an Anaconda!

### Visit Royal (Brighton) Pavilion

The Royal Pavilion and surrounding gardens is a Grade I listed former royal residence. Beginning in 1787, it was built as a seaside retreat for George, Prince of Wales (later King George IV). It is built in an Indian style and extended by John Nash.



### Volk's Electric Railway

The world's oldest operating electric railway, opened in 1883. A one mile track running alongside the beach.

### What you may not dump

The following will not be accepted:

Fridge/freezers, asbestos, tyres, batteries, fluorescent tubes, paints (including residue in paint cans), aerosols, gas canisters, oil, fuels, liquids, contaminated soils, hazardous/toxic waste, clinical waste, food waste, electrical appliances (eg: TVs washing machines; tumble dryers), plasterboard, substances hazardous to health (eg: cleaning products/chemicals; pesticides), mattresses.
